Round 8 of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program is now open!

Round 8 is open for voucher and reimbursement applications from 10:00am Wednesday 9 October 2024, until the funding allocation runs out.

Eligible families can apply for either a \$200 voucher or reimbursement for each eligible child. To be eligible, your child/dependent must be:

- A Victorian resident
- Aged 0 to 18 years old
- Named on a Health Care Card and Medicare Card, or
- Named on a Pensioner Concession Card and Medicare Card.

Special consideration may apply if your child/dependent is a Victorian resident, aged 0 to 18 years old and is currently residing in Victorian Care Services or a temporary visa holder, undocumented migrant or international student.

INFORMATION FOR SUCCESSFUL VOUCHER APPLICANTS

Present your voucher code to your activity provider when you pay and get up to \$200 off the cost of registration and membership (as well as any included uniforms and equipment). Choose your activity provider carefully as there are no cancellations for change of mind.

Apply for a voucher while the round is open and use it for a summer sport, winter sport or term-based activity until vouchers expire on Tuesday 29 April 2025.

Apply now at <u>getactive.vic.gov.au/vouchers</u> for your voucher. Be sure to check the FAQs before you apply.

INFORMATION FOR REIMBURSEMENT APPLICANTS

If you have already paid for your child's activity, you can apply for reimbursement. You must have paid for your child's activity between 1 July 2024 until the time of submitting the application to be eligible for reimbursement.

School preparations for the bushfire season

Each year, we undertake a range of activities to ensure the safety of our school and to prepare for bushfires and grassfires

An important part of this process is communicating to parents what will happen when certain fire danger ratings are issued to help ensure the



Our school has been identified as being at risk of bushfire or grassfire and is a Category 3

Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in North East fire

Closure of the school due to a Catastrophic fire danger rating will be enacted when the Bureau of Meteorology <u>forecast</u> and related public safety messaging are confirmed. Due to uncertainties in the forecast, the timing of this confirmation may vary. Information regarding potential or confirmed Catastrophic fire danger days will be communicated to you by COMPASS notifications.

It is also important to be aware that:

- No one will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled. School camps will be cancelled and if possible rescheduled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for fire weather district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas that have Catastrophic fire danger

As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and cleared our facility's grounds and gutters of all flammable debris.

- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers
- Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan, being active COMPASS our main commu nication platform.
- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements if our school is closed due to Catastrophic fire danger. Further information can
- Action your family's bushfire survival plan if your own triggers are met. Our school community may be spread out across many areas and some families may be at higher risk than others. Your family's safety is critical, so please let us know if you are actioning your bushfire survival plan and if your children will be absent on these days.

 If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.

Families are encouraged to action their <u>Bushfire Survival Plan</u> on Catastrophic fire danger rating days in their district. The safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day. On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the department's policy?

The Department of Education annually assesses the fire risk of all schools and early childhood services with the support of the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO). They are allocated a category of risk (categories 0 to 6). Schools and services that are Categories 0-3 are published on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR). Schools at some risk of bushfire and grassfire are published on the Category 4 List.

The department's <u>Bushfire and Grassfire Preparedness Policy</u> requires all schools and early childhood services on the BARR and the Category 4 List to close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. All school bus routes which travel in or through a district with Catastrophic fire danger must also be cancelled.

The policy also requires that schools at the highest risk of bushfire (those in Categories 0, 1 and 2 of the Bushfire At-Risk Register) enact pre-emptive action plans based on the fire danger forecast for their Local Government Area (LGA).

Who issues fire danger forecasts?

The Bureau of Meteorology (BoM) provides public fire danger rating forecasts each day of the fire danger period using fire weather district areas. In Victoria, there are 9 fire weather districts, which are based on Local Government Area boundaries.

The department uses these forecasts when supporting schools to enact their pre-emptive bushfire actions plans.
